\_\_\_\_ 1. **Middle School Boys Soccer** (Practice: 3:10-4:00, Futsal Pitch Mr. Papapetrou) Come out and improve your soccer skills and play games on island with other private schools. We will be entering a private school tournament for ages 13-15. Please note that for the private school tournament only 10-12 students will be selected to participate. Selection will be done by the coach.

\_\_\_\_ 10. **High School Model United Nations** (Room 112 3:10-4:00, Ms. Innocenti) Students will be working towards two conferences this year. MEDIMUN is an outstanding MUN Conference sponsored on-island and is usually held in Nicosia in February. In addition, students will have the opportunity to travel to MILMUN in Milan, Italy in March 2019. In MUN, Students will research and learn about current global economic, political and environmental challenges, getting ready to debate these issues with students from around the world.



\_\_\_ 11. **Middle and High School Girls Volleyball Club** (3:10-4:00 Meet on the courts, Mr. Papasolomou) Students interested in improving their volleyball skills and playing games should join in for some fun and good physical fitness.

\_\_\_ 12. **Middle and High School Students French Club** (3:10-4:00 Room 06, Ms. Karpatitis) French for Fun Level A1/A2. We will start from the beginning and we will cover gaps students might have who have joined higher French classes. We will concentrate on speaking and pronunciation with fun activities - food, music and movies, small projects, online games and many more ...

\_\_\_ 13 **Middle and High School Mosaics Club** (3:10-4:00 Room 204, Ms. Loizidou) Students interested in learning how to work with mosaic tiles to create creative and beautiful items should join in and let Ms. Katerina show you how much fun it can be!

\_\_\_ 14. **Middle and High School Eco Club** (3:10-4:00 Room 212, Mr. Poulos) The Eco Club Program aims to increase awareness about the rapidly growing environmental problems caused by humans to the environment. Eco Club students will focus on the sustainability concepts such as waste and recycling water, energy, transportation, growing, buying, bio-diversity and climate change. By becoming part of the Eco Club, students will explore the principles of Permaculture. Students will create an Environmental Review to measure the school's environment footprint and an action plan to reduce waste and increase bio-diversity. Students will be involved in creating gardens, planting trees and helping to make AISC and accredited Eco School.

\_\_\_ 15. **Middle & High School Drama Club** (3:10-4:00 Meet Theatre with Mr. Correia) Students will be working on an after school drama production as well as being involved in aspects of technical theatre. (Set design/construction, script analysis, prop collection and costume/makeup design)

\_\_\_ 16. **Middle and High School Robotics and Computer Programming Club** (3:10-4:00 Computer lab 106 Mr. Coudounaris) While in this club you will learn how to develop a computer game using robotics and a programming language of your choice. If you are in Middle School to grade 9 you may choose to create games using Alice, Scratch or Microsoft's Kodu and if you are in grade 10 to 12 you may choose Game Maker or Microsoft's XNA. We can compete as a team in a Pan Cyprian prestigious school competition just like this past year when we placed first with our team

\_\_\_ 17. **High School Outdoor Adventure Club** (3:10-4:00 Room 208, Ms. Charalambous) Plan trips within Cyprus to try rock climbing, skiing, kayaking and snorkeling (depending on the season). Learn outdoor skills such as building a campfire, packing a backpack, orienteering and camp cooking.

\_\_\_ 18. **Middle and High School Yearbook** (3:10-4:00 Computer lab 108, Mr. Michaelides) Space is limited to the first 10 students that return their form) If you love to capture memories, take cool pictures, design on a computer, and express yourself through visual projects, then you should definitely think about working on the AISC Yearbook this year. Students will study photography, layout and design, and interviewing strategies, as well as learn the nitty-gritty details of production. We are looking for students who are self-motivated, cooperative, responsible, and who love to work. Creativity is a + PLUS!! And everyone who commits to this exciting year-long project will receive a FREE yearbook! Who knows ... there may even be a few pizza parties in the schedule.

\_\_\_ 19. **Middle & High School Literary Writing Group for Students in the ELL Program Only\*\*** (3:10-4:00 Room 201, Ms. Zessimopoulos) Students will receive guidance/support skills in English to improve their homework, writing and organizational skills.

\_\_\_ 20. **Middle & High School Hope of Children Club (CRC Campus Club)** (3:10-4:00 Room 203) "CRC Campus Clubs" aim to help and support children to learn about their rights, become accredited volunteers and work towards defending and promoting their interests. The "CRC Campus Clubs" with the collaboration and constant support of "Hope of Children" CRC Policy Center and the professionals in the fields of Psychology, Social Work, Law and Research will hold discussions, workshops, activities and events, aiding children to become more informed citizens, bringing a profound and essential change to our current and future society. The program of CRC Campus Clubs will be tailor made to respond to the general and specific needs of AISC. At the end of the year the children participating will be named as Young Ambassadors of "Hope of Children" CRC Policy Centre.

\_\_\_ 21. **High School Greek Language Course for Native Speakers** (Room 216 3:10-4:00, Ms. Papageorgiou) In this Activity of Greek language classes for native speakers, students will be in preparing for the Certification of Greek Language Proficiency examination.



\_\_\_\_\_ **22. Middle School Cribbage Club.** (Meet in Room 217 3:10 - 4:00, Mr. Feutz) Cribbage is a card and board game that teaches critical thinking while reinforcing basic math facts. You collect points by combining cards together to make runs, or scoring combinations. Cribbage is also a game of strategy and tactics. Sometimes you try to score points, sometimes you try to stop your opponent from scoring; every game is subtly different. This game helps develop awareness and skills in multiple forms of counting, complements, combinations, sequences, patterns, and even probabilities. It is a great game to help build creativity and patience as well as teamwork and cooperation.

\_\_\_\_\_ **23. High School Stockholm Water Project** (Meet in Room 210 3:10-4:00, Dr. Economou) Students will be continuing to prepare to participate in the National competition and the Cyprus representative will travel to Stockholm to present and compete in a bigger event. Speak to Dr. Economou if interested.

\_\_\_\_\_ **24. Grades 6 - 7 Wood Wizards.** This activity is delivered by the "Family House" located in a 2 - minute drive from the school. Students will meet in the picnic area and an AISC staff member will drive the students to the Family House (using the AISC bus). Parents must pick up their child at the **Family House, 8 Kastoros Street, 1087 Nicosia (22-262900)** from the end of the activity. **The activity will be from 3:30-4:30pm.** This is an old classic coming back! Through this club, you have the opportunity to explore books from a variety of topics and genres, from classics to more modern works. We will be reading at least two books over the activity session; possibilities for the first one include, *I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings* by Maya Angelou, *A Tale of Two Cities* by Charles Dickens and *Of Mice and Men* by John Steinbeck. Books will be chosen by you, the students.

\_\_\_\_\_ **35. Middle and High School Math Clinic** (Room 214 3:10-4:00, Mr. Tsaousis and Mr. Coudounaris) Are you a student that wants practice in Math? Do you want extra practice with Math worksheets? AISC Math Teachers and IB Math Students are here to support you. Math Clinic is open to Middle and High School students. Practice makes perfect, after all!

\_\_\_\_\_ **36. High School Workshop in Observational Drawing** (3:10-4:00 Art Room, Ms. Coles) In this workshop, students will be led through a several exercises to increase their visual observation skills and eye-hand coordination while drawing from life.

\_\_\_\_\_ **37. Middle and High School Math Olympiad** (3:10-4:00 Room207, Ms. Costi) Students will be working with Ms. Costi to practice for the on-island Math Olympiad taking place early next year. Join in and improve your math skills to be able to compete.

\_\_\_\_\_ **38. Middle and High School Pilates** (3:10-4:00 Room207, Ms. Eva) Ms. Eva is an experienced Pilates Instructor. Learn how to use this style of exercises. Pilates is designed to improve physical strength, flexibility, and posture, and enhance mental awareness.
