The Fall Session for Middle and High School after-school activities will begin on Monday, September 9. Please return the last page of this packet to Ms. Christina Chari, our school secretary located in the foyer by Thursday, September 5 to ensure that you have a spot in the activities you choose. Fall Activities will end on November 21. Please note that we do have after school bussing for students involved in activities. Be aware that in order for an activity to take place there must be enough student interest.

After initial enrollment, students have two weeks to decide to remain, leave, or add (if space is available) any after-school activities. After two weeks, students are no longer allowed to add activities and must wait for the next session. Students who have more than two absences or do not participate in the activity they sign up for will be asked to drop the activity.

MONDAY

High School Model United Nations (3:05-4:00pm, Room 112, Ms. Innocenti) Students will be working towards two conferences this year. MEDIMUN, is an outstanding MUN conference sponsored on-island and is usually held in Nicosia in February. There is also an opportunity to travel to Thessaloniki, Greece in December, 2019, but we must have enough interest to travel. In MUN, Students will research and learn about current global economic, political and environmental challenges, getting ready to debate these issues with students from around the world.

Middle and High School French Club (3:05-4:00pm, Room 06, Ms. Karpasitis) French for Fun Level A1/A2. We will start from the beginning and we will cover gaps students might have who have joined higher French classes. Math Clinic for Grades 8-9 (3:05-4:00pm, Room 116, Mr. Hanson) Are you a student who wants practice in Math? Do you want extra practice with math concepts? AISC Math Teacher, Mr. Hanson is here to support you. The Math Clinic is open. Practice makes perfect, after all!

Middle and High School Mosaics Club (3:05-4:00pm, Room 204, Ms. Loizidou) Students will have an opportunity to create simple, fun and interesting Art and crafts. Join in and improve your arts and crafts skills.

New and Returning MS & HS School Hope of Children Club (3:05-4:00pm, Room 203 & 217) Please note that there will be two clubs. Students will be divided into two groups – BEGINNERS AND LAST YEARS PARTICIPANTS. (CRC Campus Club) "CRC Campus Clubs" aim to help and support children to learn about their rights, become accredited volunteers and work towards defending and promoting their interests. The "CRC Campus Clubs" with the collaboration and constant support of "Hope of Children" CRC Policy Centre and the professionals in the fields of Psychology, Social Work, Law and Research will hold discussions, workshops, activities and events, aiding children to become more informed citizens, bringing a profound and essential change to our current and future society. The program of CRC Campus Clubs will be tailor made to respond to the general and specific needs of AISC. At the end of the year the children participating will be named as Young Ambassadors of "Hope of Children" CRC Policy Centre.

Middle and High School Robotics and Computer Programming Club (3:05-4:00pm, Computer Lab 106, Mr. Coudounaris) While in this club you will learn how to develop a computer game using robotics and a programming language of your choice. If you are in Middle School to grade 9 you may choose to create games using Alice, Scratch or Microsoft's Kodu and if you are in grade 10 to 12 you may choose Game Maker or Microsoft's XNA. We can compete as a team in a Pan-Cyprian prestigious school competition just like this past year when we placed first with our team!

Competitive Swimming Grades 6-9 (3:05-4:00pm, Swimming Pool, Mr. Papapetrou) Join the swim team and have an opportunity to compete in an on-island competition. The Grammar School annually holds a swimming competition in late October. Please note that this activity is for experienced swimmers and not beginners. The practices will take place at AISC until further instructions from the coaches.

High School Duke of Edinburgh Award Ages 14+-The International Award Bronze Award candidates (3:05-4:00pm, Room 109, Mr. Jim Moore) This club is for students interested in participating in a program where they want to challenge themselves in the areas of creativity, service and physical activities. (SJWP) competition and the Global Inventors Forum (GiF), as well as participate in “The Land Rover 4x4 in Schools Technology Challenge” and the “F1 in schools” competition. This year’s GiF challenge will be looking specifically for students to demonstrate awareness of environmental issues – perfect for students also participating in the AISC Eco-club. Note that after the official registration to any of the competitions above you must remain committed to this club for the whole of the academic year.

Beginners Wood Wizards (3:30-4:30pm, pickup from the Wood Wizards Workshop, 23 Nikis Street, 22-262909)

Grades 6-7, Wood Wizards. This activity is for students who are signing up for the Wood Wizards Activity for the first time. (The advanced workshop will take place on Thursdays and is for students who have previously participated in this after-school activity). It is delivered by the “Wood Wizards Workshop” located in a 2-minute drive from the school. Students will meet in the picnic area and an AISC staff member will drive the students to the Family House (using the AISC bus). Parents must pick up their child at the Wood Wizards Workshop, 23 Nikis Street, 1087 Nicosia (22-262909) from the end of the activity. The activity will be from 3:30-4:30pm. This is an old classic coming back! A STEM favourite, the Wood Wizards Workshop teaches students hand-on skills, while thinking about shape, size, contrast, comparisons, spatial relationships and problem-solving in a practical approach. The Family house trusts its students to work with real, children-sized tools. While the Wood Wizards provides children with an inspiring means to become makers, tinkerers and engineers, safety is always emphasized. Over the 10 weeks, children will be introduced to safety rules, tools and their properties. As their skill levels increase, they will move forward to increased tool usage and will be creating exciting projects. Children will get to take home their finished projects! No need for prior experience. Please note that families will need to pay a cost of 110 euros pre-paid for the ten-week session (45 euros per month) directly to the Wood Wizards Workshop).

MS & HS Boys Competitive Soccer Club (2:05 – 4:00pm, Stovolos Park Pitches, Mr. Papasolomou) Students who would like to try out for the AISC Soccer Team(s) should join in. After a two-week tryout, students will be split up into two teams. Team A will be representing AISC in the Private School League under age 15 as well as the AISC Soccer Tournament that will be held late in the year. Team B will be working on practicing & improving their soccer skills and may have the possibility of making the A team later in the year. Team A will be practicing twice weekly. Team B will be practicing once a week on Wednesday.

Intermediate/Advanced Wood Wizards Workshop (3:30-4:30pm, pickup from the Wood Wizards Workshop, 23 Nikis Street, 22-262909)

MS Grades 6-7 This activity is for students who have previously participated in the Wood Wizards after-school activity. (The beginners' workshop will take place on Tuesday and is for students who have not previously participated in this after-school activity). It is delivered by the "Wood Wizards Workshop" located in a 2-minute drive from the school. Students will meet in the picnic table area and an AISC staff member will drive the students to the Wood Wizards Workshop, using the AISC bus. Parents must pick up their child at the Wood Wizards Workshop, 23 Nikis Street, 1087 Nicosia (22-262909) from the end of the activity. This is an old classic coming back! A STEM favourite, the Wood Wizards Workshop teaches students hands-on skills. Students will be working on their fine motor skills and eye-hand coordination, use their math skills, while thinking about shape, size, contrast, comparisons, spatial relationships and problem-solving in a practical approach. The Wood Wizards Workshop trusts its students to work with real, children-sized tools. While the Wood Wizards Workshop provides children with an inspiring means to become makers, tinkers and engineers, safety is always emphasized. Over the 10 weeks, children will be introduced to safety rules, tools and their properties. As their skill levels increase, they will move forward to increased tool usage and will be creating exciting projects. Children will get to take home their finished projects! Eco Club students will focus on sustainability concepts such as waste and recycling, water, energy, transportation, growing, buying, bio-diversity and climate change. By becoming part of the ECO Club, you will explore the principles of Permaculture. You will create an Environmental Review to measure the school's environmental footprint and an action plan to reduce waste and increase bio-diversity. You will be involved in creating gardens, planting trees and helping to make AISC an accredited Eco School.

High School ART Workshop (3:05-4:00pm, Art Room, Ms. Coles) In this workshop, students will be led through a several exercises to increase their visual observation skills and getting their work completed through support from Ms. Coles.

Grades 8-12 Yearbook Club (3:05-4:00pm, Computer Lab 108, Mr. Alexi Michaelides) Space is limited to the first 10 students that return their form. If you love to capture memories, take cool pictures, design on a computer, and express yourself through visual projects, then you should definitely think about working on the AISC Yearbook this year. Students will study photography, layout and design, interviewing strategies, as well as learn the nitty-gritty details of production. HS Café Scientifique (3:05-4:00pm, Room 214, Mr. Tsaousis) If you are a High School student who is interested in Science, feel free to join us. Here you can discuss any science related topic, have Skype conversations with scientists and organize science events for our school.
